A Memorial service for Louis Charles Visconti, 80, of Melrose Park, will be held on February 6th at Carbonara Funeral Home in Melrose Park, IL. The family has chosen cremation and will receive friends from 1:00pm to 5:00pm. Louie passed away peacefully on Monday, December 27, 2021 at AMITA Health Resurrection Medical Center after a long battle with cancer. He was born on October 12, 1941 to the late Sam and Josephine (Gulino) Visconti. On December 2, 2013, he married Diane (Coor). He was a retired plumber with Local Union 130.

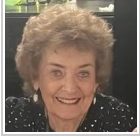
