Sylvia made lifelong friends wherever she worked, and those friendships always outlasted the various jobs.

Sylvia spoke English and Italian fluently, and understood the ways of finance better than any banker on Wall Street.

Her greatest pleasure was taking care of her husband Sidney, a Chicago police officer, and her four children, who tried to drive her crazy sometimes. Sundays at home were like feast days: she always prepared delicious meals and everyone was welcome at her table. Her Thanksgiving and Christmas Eve feasts were legendary. She raised her family in Galewood, and made both education and pursuing dreams a dual priority. She supported her children in every career and life path they choose, and encouraged them all to be happy and successful. She was a loving and supportive wife who took great care of her husband always, nursing him through every illness with tender care.
